#### Hiking in Ireland September 5-19, 2020

The excursion will start in the Connemara region on the wild Atlantic coast: we'll walk to a tidal island and ferry to another, sleep in a small village beside Ireland's only fjord, and look for the remains of ancient Celtic churches. Then we'll move on to Northern Ireland to hike the coast from Portstewart to Cushendall. Daily treks will wind past remnants of medieval castles and a whiskey distillery, across open moors, and through ancient oak woodlands where the Game of Thrones was filmed.

Each day features one hike, self-paced and self-guided. Maps will be provided, along with route guidance. Personal GPS devices are encouraged. Hikes average twelve miles daily and are rated moderate to energetic due to terrain and elevation.

Macs Adventures will arrange accommodations, luggage transfer, and maps. Some overnights will be in very small villages with just one pub for dining; other sites will have multiple offerings and shopping options.

Cost per individual with room sharing is \$2,200. Individuals requesting single rooms will pay an additional \$505. Breakfast is included, but other meals will be at hiker's own expense. Macs estimates meal costs to average \$25 - \$45 per person per day. Travel from the Republic of Ireland to Northern Ireland is included. Travel from the US to Dublin, and local connections to the excursion start and at the finish are not included. However public transportation options to and from our excursion locales to Dublin Airport are inexpensive (about \$100 in total) and readily available.

Due to the small number of beds in some of our overnight stays, group size is limited to fifteen. Those interested should email Karen no earlier than 12/15 at 9 am. Initial down payment paid directly to Macs (amount to be determined) will be due two weeks later.

Julie Wojcik and I volunteered to be part of Fleet Response's Health Fair in Independence on October 2. We had a vendor table, which had our CHC banner displayed, hiking maps of the various parks in which we hike, schedules, CHC brochures, poster boards that showed the hikes around the states and world, and the cabin social functions. We passed out water and Life Savers, because hiking is a life saver! (Plus, you have to stay hydrated!) ### A Centennial Hike Challenge Won, Part VI

Congratulations to all who have completed the Centennial Mile High Challenge. Dan Herris just missed the Mile High with 5,023 feet (8/10 to 8/20). David Tobiasz reached it with 6,000 feet (9/24 to 10/2) and 5,630 feet (10/13 to 10/23). The successful 100-mile hikers Erik Baldwin, Matt Smith, Karen Barton and Joel Edmonds achieved this challenge over the Labor Day weekend. Also achieving the Mile High Challenge, during the June England trip, are Gayle Shroy, Zelfa Sawaya, Nancy Sogg, and Betsy Luce.

To complete the challenge, hikers must climb 4,280 feet (Gold Level), or 5,280 feet (Mile-High Challenge) on any number of CHC hikes within ten consecutive days. To document elevation attained, hikers may use trail maps that specify distance and elevation gain, including CVNP trail maps and other printed or online hiking guides. The source material must include the elevation gain for the trails hiked. Hikers may also use phone-based trail apps like All Trails, or a GPX file that can be exported from a GPS unit or a better-quality phone app.


# Safety Tips: Ice

The statistic boggled Joe Visitorski's mind: about a million Americans are injured annually by falling on snow or ice, and about 17,000 of these injuries are fatal. Hikers are especially exposed to this hazard because they spend so much time outdoors. Joe's solution is to wear a hockey helmet and thick padding when he hikes in winter. He still falls, but he bounces, and it's kind of fun.

Sporting goods stores sell clamp-on devices that attach to boots and improve traction. Some use springs, chains, or metal studs to grip the ice. These all work, but there can be problems; springs or chains can snag roots and debris on trails. Wet snow can clog them and then freeze. Excessively worn studs can even increase the likelihood of slipping on hard ice. Studs screwed directly into the soles of hiking boots, on the other hand, are easy to replace when worn, don't fall off, and won't collect ice, snag roots, or require adjustment. Here's an inexpensive way to convert old hiking boots to ice boots.

At a hardware store, buy 22 slotted hex head sheet metal screws, #8 x 1/2". Use a 1/4" hex nut driver, or a 1/4" socket wrench on an electric screwdriver, to install the screws into the soles of your hiking boots, as shown in the illustration. The screws should be about 3/8" in from the edge of the soles. Adjust the spacing so that the screws are driven into the existing rubber cleats on the boots.

For those readers who have been to Scotland or plan to visit, settle in this winter with this gripping, intense, complex mystery that will satisfy those who are environmentally conscious. The grandeur, isolation and stormy beauty of the Hebridean Islands serve as a wild, unpredictable fourth character.

On the remote Isle of Harris in Scotland's Outer Hebrides, a man washes up on a deserted beach, hypothermic and completely disoriented. He has no idea who he is or how he got there. The only clue to his condition is a map of the island showing a desolate, ancient path called the Coffin Road. With a sense of dread and no clear idea what lies at the other end, he knows he must follow the trail if he has any hope of discovering his identity.

Meanwhile, homicide detective George Gunn makes the rough ocean crossing to a remote, sea-battered lighthouse on a rock in the northern Atlantic, twenty miles west of the Outer Hebrides, to investigate a brutal murder. Despite its isolation, the tiny island has seen its share of tragedy: more than a century earlier, three lighthouse keepers disappeared, never to be seen or heard from again. And now there is a new tragedy, and Gunn must figure out what happened.

At the same time, a teenage girl lies in her Edinburgh bedroom, desperate to discover the truth about her father's death. Two years after the discovery of the pioneering scientist's suicide note, Karen Fleming still cannot accept that her father would willingly abandon her. And the more she discovers about the nature of his research, the more she suspects that suicide had nothing to do with it.

# **Highlights — CHC General Meeting**

October 26, 2019 Camp Onwego

Board members in attendance: Peggy Koesel, Matt Collings, Joan Delahay, Barb Meyer, Ellen Papadimoulis, Rita Stroempl, Denise Tobiasz, and Julie Wojcik. Absent: Mary Bradshaw, Dave Hobe, Ron Hueter, Lee Hutton, Gayle Shroy, Diana Stack, Sharon Uhl, and Debbie Wood.

Peggy Koesel commenced the general meeting at 1:51 pm. Sixty-two members were present.

Guest Speakers: Sharon Holtkamp and John Wagner from the US Census Bureau's Cleveland Office presented information about temporary work for the 2020 Census.

Awards and Recognition: Peggy acknowledged centennial challenge hikers, Emerald Necklace hike leaders, event hosts, and committee members. Sharon Horvath presented mileage awards.

Strategic Objectives: Peggy reviewed the club's strategic objectives and provided statistics through the third quarter. We are close to meeting all targets. 596 members (600 target) are hiking at least once a month. An average of 302 members (325 target) are hiking a mile-a-day. We are on target to meet 90% membership retention rate. Injuries are under 12, only 4 requiring medical attention to date. We have exceeded our hiking-related donations goal, with \$1,100 donated as of September 2019. Our budget is on target with less than a 5% variance, except for the increased printing costs.

Dues Increase: After September financial review, the board determined actual expenditures will be higher than budgeted by year-end and will remain higher moving forward. As a result, the board approved a \$6.00 per year dues increase. Options such as using camp funds or prior reserves were considered and the board concluded that raising dues for the first time in 12 years was the fiscally responsible choice. This will enable us to continue to meet the increased printing costs, cover some centennial expenses, rent canopy shelters to increase capacity for outdoor events at camp, and modernize our website and data management capabilities.

Election Results: Barb Appel filled in for Katherine Malmquist as CHC Teller. Katherine recused herself as she was on the ballot. Ron Hueter, Corresponding Secretary, delivered sealed ballots to Barb. The Teller Committee opened and counted 503 of the 509 ballots received (6 were invalid).

On October 14, 2019, the Teller Committee (Cathy King, Beth Arcady, CJ Keys, and Leslie Leventhal) joined Barb Appel to tally the votes. The following officers, directors, and trustees were elected: Peggy Koesel (President); April Sampson (Treasurer); Matt Collings (Chief Pathfinder); Katherine Malmquist (Recording Pathfinder); Dave Hobe (Trustee); Larry Clager (Director); Sharon Horvath (Director); Rita Stroempl (Director); Sharon Uhl (Director).

New Life Member: Matilda Varga has been a CHC member for 50 years and has hiked over 30,000 miles. Matilda will become a Life Member of the CHC on January 1, 2020 and her membership will be free going forward.

Health Care Outreach Coordinators: Diana Stack, Julie Wojcik, and Sharon Uhl have created a presentation package with a display board, brochures, and CHC banner that members may use to represent CHC at events such as health fairs or employer wellness programs. This team would welcome assistance to present materials when requests come in.

Camp Improvements: Camp Maintenance Committee Chair, Bob DiVincenzo has worked tirelessly to complete many needed projects around Camp Onwego, including installing 8 new windows, painting and replacing siding on many structures, installing flood lights and wiring for canopy lights, and removing hazardous trees.

CHC Holiday Party will be held on Saturday, December 7, at Tremont City Side Ballroom at Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church at 2187 West 14<sup>th</sup> Street. The \$40 price covers food, music, and more. Reservation forms are due to Dave Richards by November 27. Bring canned food and white socks for our charity collection.

The meeting adjourned at 2:24 pm.
