The President's Corner

As we prepare to wrap up 2022, this article will focus on some aspects of CHC business for 2023. There've been lots of discussion about introducing "add-on" hikes to the hiking schedule. Opinions vary. I favor trying it out. It should allow hike leaders more flexibility as to when and where hikes are offered; allowing for opportunities presented by surprisingly good weather (like a few days of 70-degree temps in February) or special community events (think Tall Ships visit to Cleveland). We're going to try a pilot project to help club leadership and membership evaluate its worth. I respect the fact that the prospect of change is very uncomfortable, even if all we are doing is exploring possibilities. Recognizing that fact, please know that we are giving very careful consideration as to the planning of a pilot project, as described below.

An ad hoc committee is working diligently to design and implement the pilot project. What exactly is an "add-on" hike? The basic concept is to allow a hike leader to add a hike to the published schedule due to unique or special considerations that were unforeseen during the regular hike scheduling period some two to three months prior. The wide variety of hikes offered by CHC in terms of frequency, pace and terrain is a hallmark of our hiking club. These "add-on" hikes should supplement the robust hiking schedule we currently enjoy. As a way to avoid confusion and manage expectations for our members, leaders will have a cap on the number of "add-ons" they can request in a given month - perhaps as few as just one or two per leader. Scheduling of an "add-on" hike will go through the Pathfinder Committee, as do all of our hikes. The goal as I understand it from the committee's report, is to have a quick turn-around time from request to approval to announcement of an "add-on" hike being offered. Mechanisms for announcement already exist with our eblast communications and webpage. I am glad that we are giving this idea a chance. More to follow.

Shifting gears, I want to focus on Camp Onwego. Bob DiVincenzo, Camp Maintenance Chairperson, and I have talked about the need for more volunteer help to keep our camp a pleasant resource for members. Onwego has been the site of many well attended social events and meetings through spring, summer, and fall. Thanks to the continued diligence of Bob and a small team of volunteers with timely maintenance and upkeep, major repairs have been avoided

and the appearance of the property is pleasing and tidy. Over the winter months, Bob and I would like to develop an enhanced resource pool of volunteers to help with ongoing, routine camp maintenance. Outdoor maintenance is weather dependent, which presents a huge challenge when recruiting and scheduling volunteers. Bob will attest to this when scheduling spring and fall clean up days. What we are looking at is a schedule of volunteers who offer to be available for a period, such as a week, during which time Bob could contact them for maintenance chores, weather permitting. As a volunteer for that time, one would agree to keep their schedule open and flexible. I have agreed to help by organizing a schedule of volunteers willing to cut grass, trim bushes, pick up twigs and sticks after a storm, rake leaves, etc. If you have a week or so available between May and October next year, please let me know so we can put together a group of volunteers to assist with camp maintenance.

Assistance with routine maintenance will be needed as completion of the pavilion project is also planned for 2023. There also will be a need for assistance with this project in terms of volunteers with construction skills and experience. If you fit that description, Bob would like to hear from you. The implementation of this project is planned to begin in spring. Bob will decide how volunteers can best assist with the project, when an individual's skills and expertise may be needed. The pavilion project has been planned for a while and eagerly anticipated by all. Despite recent delays, I am glad that we can now move forward.

When making your New Year's resolutions, remember CHC needs you. There are so many ways to help. Committee chairpersons do not know everyone's skills, interests or availability when searching for assistance. Please step forward as a volunteer if you identify something with which you might be interested in helping. No experience necessary in most cases!

Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) is a form of depression, which affects people year after year – and in varying degrees. It's the feeling of doom and gloom as sunlight/daylight is reduced during the winter months.

For some, it starts just as the days get shorter and invariably darker as there is less daylight. It affects each person differently, as some only need a short amount of daylight – others may need medication or light therapy to prevent episodes of depression (and in a few cases – suicide).

Ways to ward off SAD:

- Get plenty of exercise and light indoors and outdoors. Stay socially active. (Weight gain is common.)
- Utilize a light box for about 30 minutes in either the morning or evening. Check with a doctor for specifications of a light box that will meet your needs.
- Medication for more severe symptoms.
 (Sometimes multiple therapies may be needed).
- Talk Therapy also known as Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) – which works on unproductive thoughts and behaviors, and how they are acknowledged by the person.
- Travel to warmer and sunnier climates. Think "snowbirds."

Highlights — CHC Board Meeting

Tuesday, November 1, 2022, via zoom video

Board members in attendance: Sharon Uhl, Patty Anderson, Ann Biery, Barb Buser, Larry Clager, Sharon Horvath, Ron Hueter, Lee Hutton, Bob Kimmelfield, Ted Krauss, Mary Kurtz, Katherine Malmquist, Ellen Papadimoulis, April Sampson, Julie Wojcik. Also attending: Kathy Driscoll. Excused: Maggie Savoy.

President Sharon Uhl called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm. The minutes from the October 3, 2022 board meeting were approved as written.

Treasurer – April Sampson presented the October 31, 2022 financial information to the Board. The year-to-date financial activity consisting of revenue and expenses was presented. Our budgeted numbers were reviewed and compared to expectations. The Board approved the financial information as presented. April noted that annually we need to formally opt out of trash pick-up at Camp Onwego to avoid being charged for a service we do not utilize. Although the Kids Day event was not sponsored the last couple of years due to the impact of the pandemic, the Board would like to continue the event; it therefore will stay in our budget. The Board was updated that we should receive notification on our pending request to reduce our tax valuation for Camp Onwego by the middle of November, 2022.

Chief Pathfinder – Mary Kurtz reported that hikes are now being scheduled for the January and February 2023 cycle. There are fourteen days left until the November 15 deadline, and many hikes are scheduled during the last four days.

Recording Secretary – Katherine Malmquist submitted October, 2022 hike statistics. 287 members hiked a mile-a-day, and 557 hiked at least once. The average number of hikers per local hike was 9.4.

Corresponding Secretary – Ron Hueter reported that the mailings were all done on time with no issues. Extra printed schedules were available at the Chili Cookoff at Camp Onwego on October 29.

Safety Committee – Julie Wojcik reported that there were two injuries with hikers seeking medical attention in both September and October. (She reported one injury for September at the October meeting, but later received additional information). The CHC target is to keep injuries under 12, but this year it looks like there will be 13. Julie writes articles on safety to mitigate injuries.

Membership Recognition – The Board approved Ted Krauss' recommendation for a Significant Achievement Award to Chuck Smith for completing the Appalachian Trail (2014 to 2022).

Camp Maintenance – Sharon Uhl shared her discussion with Bob DiVincenzo. The cabin and campgrounds are in "pretty good shape." Expanding a group of members to commit regularly scheduled times for jobs, such as cutting grass, trimming trees, etc. would be helpful. Bob has priced out construction materials for the pavilion and will have cost estimates for the pavilion for the December meeting.

Continuing in their two-year terms in 2022 are: Corresponding Secretary – Ron Hueter; Recording Secretary – Maggie Savoy; Directors – Barb Buser, Ted Krauss, Lee Hutton, and Julie Wojcik. Trustees – Dave Hobe and Doug Hardman.

CHC Merchandise - The fall merchandise sale with Big Frog is now active online and will run through December 31, 2022.

2022 Election - The following members were newly elected to officer, director, and trustee positions effective January 1, 2023: Debbi Oblak for Recording Secretary; Gene Baxendale for Corresponding Secretary; Ann Biery, Teresa Davey, Stephen Foster, Ted Krauss, and Marianne Vest for Directors; and Edwin Harstine for Trustee.

1206 members were eligible to vote. 32% of the members voted electronically. Assistance was given to those who requested help in using the electronic ballot system.

Donation to Community Organization – The Board approved a \$250.00 donation to the Nature Center at Shaker Lakes from the outreach committee funds.

Excursion Issue – The Board reviewed a member's email regarding compensation from HF Holidays for a cancelled portion of the trip due to a COVID outbreak. HF offered alternate accommodations with self-guided tours to those who decided to stay. The Board was understanding, but clarified that while it approves excursions, the club excursion leader books the trips. The CHC does not negotiate with third party providers. It was decided that we will still use HF for excursions, since this was an unusual circumstance. It was suggested that travelers consider purchasing travel insurance for their trips.

Add-on Hikes Ad Hoc Committee – Mary Kurtz reported that the committee has been meeting weekly with the task of looking at special, unusual, seasonal hikes to be scheduled within a timeline of three days. The technology committee will be able to provide information on the number of hikes, interested hike leaders, member participation in hikes and impact on regular schedules. The ad hoc committee is now working on what criteria will be used to approve or deny these special hike requests.

Cuyahoga Valley Conservancy Events – The Cuyahoga Valley Conservancy has approached Sharon Uhl about partnering on events with the Cleveland Hiking Club. In the past, the CHC has planned joint hikes with the conservancy and CHC hike leaders. These have fallen aside with the pandemic, but could once again be considered. Sharon or a designee will follow-up with the conservancy.

2023 Calendar – Sharon asked the Board to review dates on the 2023 calendar for next year's board meetings.

December Board Meeting – The final CHC board meeting of 2022 will be on Tuesday, December 6, at 6:30 pm at the Garfield Branch of the Cuyahoga County Public Library, Room #B, on 5409 Turney Road, Cleveland, Ohio 44125. New board members will be invited to attend.

Meeting adjourned at 8:36 pm.
